This seminar is intended for a wide audience, including managers, researchers, planning and evaluation staff and practitioners in

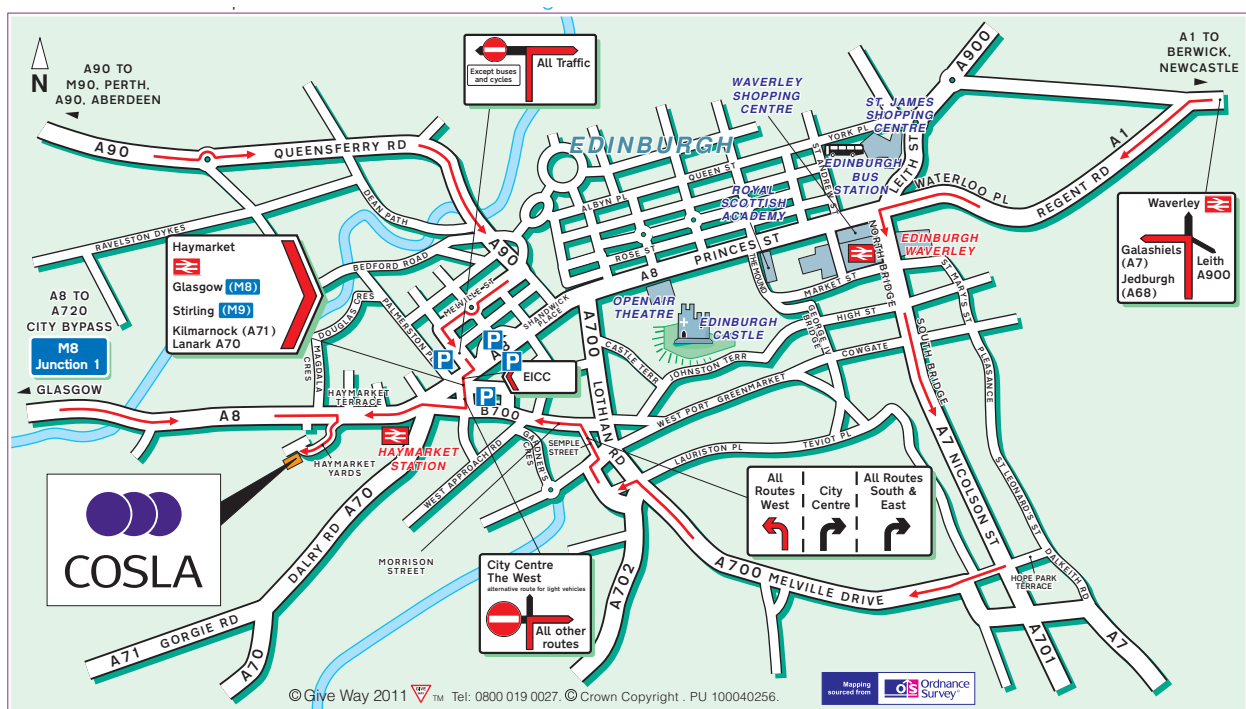
- local government
